level 3	<p>The student will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • introduce the topic • develop it using only relevant information • arrange the information using a specific organizational strategy • use appropriate transitions to clarify the relationships between the ideas and concepts presented in the text • establish and maintain a formal writing style • include graphics to help readers understand the text's content • provide a conclusion that follows from the information or explanation presented earlier in the text 	<p>Without help, "I can"</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • write facts and details that go with the topic, such as pictures, drawings, tables, or other ways that describe the topic and what they mean • use words and phrases that explain the topic • organize my writing around the purpose for writing • write a conclusion that restates topic information in the paragraph
